### **Referee Requirements**

- Each team must provide two (2) volunteer referees.

## **Coaches' Responsibilities**

- Attend a Mandatory Coach Clinic Coaches must be trained to the level they are coaching.
   No exceptions.
- Complete Safe Haven Training Online annually per AYSO National Guidelines.
- Roster Pick-Up/Coach Meeting Date will be sent by email to the coaches.
- Appoint a Team Manager (TM) Helps with organization so you can focus on coaching.
  - Team Manager Requirements: Must be an AYSO-registered volunteer, Safe Haven certified, and complete all California-mandated courses (CDC Concussion, Sudden Cardiac Arrest, SafeSport).
- TM may fill in for a coach when briefly absent for a game or practice Coach Binder If you anticipate being unavailable for a game or practice, leave your coach binder with registration forms with your Assistant Coach or Team Manager.

# **IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR COACHES**

- Your coach binder must be present at all games and practices.
- The binder contains player registration forms and accident reports in case of injury.
- If the head coach is absent, the Assistant Coach or Team Manager must have a copy of the coaching binder.

## **Health & Safety Guidelines**

- COVID-19 Protocols Please ask non-family members to maintain distance while on the field to help prevent the spread of COVID-19.
- Follow all City, County, and State regulations and AYSO Region 73 guidelines.

## **Team Organization & Volunteer Roles**

### **Assistant Coach**

- Appoint an Assistant Coach who will step in when needed.
- They must complete the same training as the coach.
- Ensure they have copies of player registration forms or access to the coach binder.

### **Team Manager**

- Appoint a **Team Manager** to help with organization.
- They must complete:
  - Safe Haven Training
  - Volunteer Registration

### Referees

- Each team must appoint at least two (2) volunteer referees.
- Referees earn Referee Points, which are essential for the team.
- Required Training:
  - Referee Training (Provided)
  - Safe Haven Training
  - Volunteer Registration

#### **Field Parents**

- Assign reliable volunteers to:
  - Set up goals and nets (First game of the day).
  - o **Take down goals and nets** (Last game of the day).

## **Meet the Coach**

- 1. Contact your team no later than March 22, 2025. If unable, notify the league ASAP.
- 2. Hold a team meeting ASAP This is the best time to recruit volunteers.
- 3. **Inform your team of practice schedules** you can use **Sports Connect Team Central** on our website. There are other apps like GroupMe and Heja available.
- 4. **Report any drops, changes, or corrections** to the Commissioner asap.
- 5. **Organize a snack schedule** Ask the Team Manager or a parent to coordinate.

## **Post-Season Responsibilities**

- Player Evaluations An essential task to track player development. Turn in at the end of the season.
- Returning Coaches Let us know if you plan to return next season! We also welcome feedback and suggestions.

## **COACH & ASSISTANT COACH AGREEMENT**

First, **thank you** for volunteering your time, effort, and knowledge to help our young athletes grow as players and teammates. Being a **Head or Assistant Coach** is a **critical role**—coaches have the power to make this experience **memorable and meaningful** for every player.

Successful coaches are **organized**, **communicate effectively**, **and create a positive environment** for both players and parents. More than wins or scores, it is the **coaches** who shape a child's love for the game. Years from now, players may not remember every goal, but they will **always remember their coach**. We **genuinely appreciate your dedication** to AYSO Region 73 and our teams. **THANK YOU!** 

### **COACHING COMMITMENT**

As a volunteer coach for **AYSO Region 73**, I agree to adhere to all **rules**, **policies**, **and philosophies** set forth by the organization. These include, but are not limited to:

- COVID-19 Regulations I will follow City, County, and State regulations, along with AYSO Region 73 guidelines to ensure a safe playing environment.
- **AYSO Philosophies** I understand that AYSO exists **for the players** and that our focus is on **sportsmanship**, **development**, **and fun**.
- Respect for Volunteers I will be courteous and professional to all AYSO volunteers, referees, and coaches, even when I disagree with a decision.
- Equal Playtime Commitment I will ensure that:
  - All able-bodied players play at least three-quarters of every game during the regular season.
  - No player will play the entire game unless all teammates have played at least threequarters.
  - If roster size prevents this, the minimum playtime requirement is half the game, with priority given to ensure those players get three-quarters of the next game.
- Goalkeeper Playtime Restrictions
  - A player may not play more than three-quarters as a goalkeeper in a game.
  - o If a player plays three-quarters in goal, they **must** play on the field for the fourth quarter.
  - U6 & U8 Divisions Goalkeepers are not permitted; no player should be positioned as one.
- Coaching Eligibility for Postseason I understand that to be eligible for postseason play, I
  must:
  - Be trained at the level I am coaching.
  - Submit an (OORP) Out of Region Play form to the commissioner.
  - Be Safe Haven Certified.
  - Complete all California-mandated safety courses for youth sports.

- Attendance at Clinics & Meetings I will attend all mandatory coaching clinics and meetings. I will also keep my AYSO account updated with my current contact information to receive important notices.
- "No Slaughter" Rule I will take appropriate action to ensure that my team does not
  exceed a five-goal differential at any time during a game. If my team leads by a large margin,
  I will:
  - Encourage passing plays.
  - Allow players to try new positions.
  - o Focus on skill-building rather than scoring.
  - This helps demonstrate positive coaching by fostering an environment of respect, fairness, and growth for all players.
- Promoting a Positive Experience I recognize that AYSO's vision is for all players to have fun—including the players on the opposing team. Next season, I may even coach some of them!

### **UNIFORM PICKUP GUIDELINES**

Please make every effort to pick up uniforms on the scheduled date due to limited storage space. If you are unable to pick up the uniforms, you must send either: Your Assistant Coach OR your Team Manager

**Important:** The **Coach Agreement** and **Field Agreement** must be submitted at the time of uniform pickup.

## **DISTRIBUTING UNIFORMS**

- Uniforms are numbered by size:
  - Lower numbers = Smaller sizes and Higher numbers = Larger sizes
- Best Practice: Line up your players from shortest to tallest and distribute uniforms accordingly.
- **Notify parents** before handing out uniforms to ensure proper distribution.
- Wait until you can meet with all players to distribute uniforms, this prevents sizing issues.
- If a player is absent, ask for their size in advance.
- Uniform Exchanges: Perfect fits are not guaranteed, please distribute as fairly as possible.



## FIELD AGREEMENT

### **USE OF KPSV SOCCER FIELDS & FACILITIES FOR PRACTICE**

AYSO Practice Schedule: Monday – Thursday | 4:00 PM – 8:00 PM March 24, 2025 – May 10, 2025

- First-come, first-serve policy: As more teams arrive, fields must be shared.
- · Field sharing guidelines:
  - Large Fields (U12 U14): At least six teams per field.
  - o Smaller Fields (U8 U10): At least four teams per field.
- Scrimmages: Allowed only between AYSO teams.
- Outside organizations: Not permitted due to liability concerns.
- Fields available for AYSO practice: Fields 15, 16, 11, and 12. Please be courteous to other coaches on the field and share the space accordingly.

### **USE OF RESTROOMS**

Please ensure **proper use and cleanliness** for the safety and comfort of all participants. Have parents keep an eye on their children

### **CODE OF CONDUCT**

Violations of this agreement include, but are not limited to:

- Using fields outside of scheduled practice times (Mon-Thurs, 4-8 PM).
- Moving goals from one field to another.
- Setting up equipment, chairs, umbrellas, or coolers in unallocated areas.

### **Behavior Violations**

- Abusing, threatening, or intimidating any AYSO Region 73 or City of Bakersfield representative.
- Sideline misconduct, including yelling, arguing, or inappropriate behavior.
- Reckless driving in the parking lot.

- Throwing stones, rocks, or debris.
- Breaking or damaging goals, chains, sprinklers, irrigation pipes, light poles, or signs.
- Defacing restrooms, buildings, parking bumpers, or traffic signs.

### **TEAM PARENT TRAINING**

- Step 1: Complete volunteer registration at AYSO73.org
- Step 2: Complete AYSO Safe Haven & safety courses for youth sports on ETrainU (ETU)

All volunteers on the team should be registered volunteers with all required safety courses completed.

- Log into your AYSO73.org account
- Go to your Volunteer Page
- Click on the AYSOU button to access training

### **TEAM PARENT DUTIES**

- > Game & Practice Responsibilities
  - ✓ Organize a snack schedule Be mindful of allergies
  - ✓ Encourage positive sideline behavior Parents cheer, coaches coach!
  - ✓ Help the coach hand out uniforms (see Uniform Information Sheet)
  - ✓ **Line up players** (smallest to tallest) when distributing uniforms. Write down the player's names and uniform numbers for the coach to fill out on the game card.
  - ✓ Ensure the field is clean after every game and practice. Please have the parents bringing snacks also bring a trash bag to dispose of any leftover trash.
- Assist the coach with filling out and preparing line cards before each game
- Team Organization & Extras
  - ✓ If your team orders a banner, do not include player names or photos for players' safety
  - ✓ Help recruit team volunteers (volunteers are required for postseason play eligibility)
  - ✓ Take a vote and collect money for trophies (if parents choose to purchase them)
  - ✓ Take a vote and collect money for a coach gift to show appreciation
  - ✓ Promote team bonding Encourage players after tough games & turn losses into learning moments

- First teams playing: Responsible for setting up nets.
- Last teams playing: Responsible for taking down nets after the game

#### **Guidelines:**

- Each family will take turns bringing snacks & drinks for the team.
- **Healthy snacks** are encouraged! Please avoid sugary sodas & candy.
- Be mindful of **allergies** especially nuts, dairy, and gluten.
- Bring enough for all the players + plus the coach and assistant.
- Have the parent bringing snacks bring a trash bag for any leftover trash.
- If your assigned date does not work, please **swap with another parent**.
- There are free team apps that can be used for the snack schedule.

**Important:** Parents arrive 10-15 minutes before game time to distribute them.

## TEAM REFEREE RESPONSIBILITIES

In Region 73, each team must provide at least two adult volunteer referees. Teams may also have additional youth referees, depending on availability and experience. These volunteer referees are essential in making sure games run smoothly and are conducted in a fair and safe environment. The duties and responsibilities of referees vary by age group, which are detailed later in this manual.

#### Who Are AYSO Referees?

All AYSO referees are volunteers, just like the coaches, administrators, and everyone else who contributes to the league's success. Many referees begin as parents of players who start volunteering when their children are young and continue as they age up through the program. Volunteers of all ages, including players themselves, are welcome to join the program. Any person 12 years or older may volunteer as a referee.

#### Referee Experience

AYSO referees come from all experience levels, ranging from first-time referees to those with many years of experience. We offer training for new referees every season, as well as refresher courses for returning referees to ensure everyone feels supported and prepared.

#### The Referee's Role:

The primary responsibility of the referee is to maintain the safety of the players while keeping the game as fair and enjoyable as possible. Specifically, the referee is tasked with:

- 1. **Ensuring player safety:** This includes monitoring the field conditions, ensuring proper equipment is being worn, and checking that players are physically ready for the game.
- 2. **Enforcing the Laws of the Game:** Referees must apply the rules consistently to ensure the game is safe, fair, and fun. They make decisions based on their knowledge of the game and are expected to do so with integrity, fairness, and professionalism.
- 3. **Monitoring spectators and behavior:** Referees must also manage sideline behavior to maintain a positive and respectful environment. This includes ensuring that spectators follow the rules of the game and that their conduct does not interfere with the enjoyment of the players or the game.
- 4. **Game management:** The referee is responsible for the flow of the game, including keeping track of time, assessing injuries, and addressing any issues that arise during play.

#### **Referee Respect and Support:**

It is important to remember that referees are volunteers just like everyone else in the league, and they deserve the same respect for their efforts. Referees, especially new ones, may make mistakes—this is a normal part of the learning process. We ask that everyone—coaches, parents, and players—be understanding and supportive of referees as they work hard to provide a wonderful experience for the kids. Respectful behavior helps maintain a positive environment for everyone involved.



#### In Summary:

- Referees ensure the game is safe, fair, and enjoyable for players.
- They are volunteers committed to the program's success.
- Respect and support from coaches, parents, and players are crucial to creating a positive environment for all.

# REFEREE REQUIREMENTS & INCENTIVES 2025 SPRING SEASON

We cannot have games without referees, and more importantly, being a referee is a rewarding experience! It is a terrific way to work with the kids and contribute to the enjoyment of the game.

### **Divisional Referee Requirements**

For the **U10**, **U12**, **U14**, and **Upper Divisions**, each team must meet the following referee requirements:

- 1. Minimum Number of Referees: Each team must provide at least two (preferably three) trained and Safe Haven certified referees. These referees must have attended official referee training.
- 2. **Spring Invitational Playoff Eligibility**: To qualify for the Spring Invitational Playoffs, each team must accumulate **18 referee points** during the season.
- 3. **New Referee Incentives**: To encourage new volunteers, newly certified referees will receive a **one-time bonus of 2 points** after officiating three matches.
- 4. **Priority for Referees**: If your team does not provide a referee, there is no guarantee that your team will have a referee for its game. Teams that provide referees will have **priority** in having a referee assigned to their games.

#### The Referee Point System & CGI Sports

Each referee will register themselves and the team(s) they represent on the CGI Sports system. Registration can be completed via the link found on the **Coach/Referee** menu on our website.

#### **Important Notes:**

- **Coaches' Involvement**: Coaches are strongly encouraged to recruit volunteers to referee, rather than refereeing themselves.
- Refereeing Your Own Team: Referees cannot officiate their own team's games without prior approval from the Referee Administrator.
- Qualified Referees Only: Only fully registered, certified, and trained referees will earn points for their team. Any non-qualifying points will be deducted from the total at the end of the season.

### **Earning Points**

 Point Allocation: Referees will earn 1 point for every game they officiate, whether as a Center Referee or Assistant Referee.

- Maximum Points Per Day: A team can earn a maximum of 3 points per game day, even if the referee works multiple games on the same day.
- **Point Tracking**: Points should be recorded on the **Lineup Card** for the game they officiate. The referee must designate the team number on the back of the game card in the "phone/email" box.
- Point Allocation Priority: The allocation on the Lineup Card takes priority over the points listed on CGI Sports or sign-up sheets. If any discrepancies arise, please confirm with the Referee Administrator.
- Additional Points: Referees who work multiple games on the same day can accumulate more points.
   For example, a referee could earn 1 point for a U10B-14 game and 2 points for a U12G-07 game if they officiate both games that day.

### **Training & Certification**

- **Referee Training**: All referees are encouraged to attend the training offered by region 73. Check our website at www.region73.org for a list of upcoming training classes.
- Additional Clinics: Other referee clinics may be available through ETU or other regions, but referees will need to travel to attend these.
- Shirts for New Referees: New referees who complete their training will receive a Region 73 referee shirt as a token of appreciation.
- Returning Referees: Returning referees are expected to stay current with the IFAB Laws of the Game (LOTG) and should attend refresher courses as needed.

#### **Final Notes**

- **Point Limits**: The maximum number of points a team can accumulate in one day is **3 points**, unless otherwise authorized by the **Referee Administrator**.
- **Volunteer Commitment**: Volunteers are key to making this league run smoothly, and your participation makes a significant difference for the players and the community.

## **AYSO LINE UP CARD (ALUC)**

The **AYSO Line Up Card (ALUC)** is an essential document in AYSO, serving as the **official record** for each match. It contains key information that helps track the game's progress and player participation.

### Importance of the ALUC:


- **Legal Document**: The ALUC is the primary legal document for any match, capturing critical details such as the players on the field, the game's score, and the time each player spent on the field.
- Player Participation: It should clearly show the names of all players and indicate the time each player played or explain the reason if a player was unable to play (e.g., injury, substitution, etc.).
- Game Details: The ALUC must include key match information such as:
  - Date and time of the game
  - Field location
  - Coaches present at the game
  - o Team names
  - Playing conditions
  - Any incidents or injuries that occurred during the game
- **Time Tracking**: It is important to note **start and finish times**, including any **time added**. However, in most league season games, there will be **no time added** to the game, as all games must be completed within the allocated time slot, including check-in time.
- **Observations**: Coaches and referees should also use the ALUC to note any observations that may be relevant for improving **game quality** or **player safety**. These notes can be valuable for future games and ensuring the well-being of the players.

### Responsibilities of Coaches and Referees:

- Game Stewards: Both coaches and referees serve as stewards of the game and are
  responsible for ensuring the ALUC is properly filled out. This includes ensuring accurate player
  times, scores, and any relevant incidents or observations.
- **Completion and Signing**: At the end of the match, both the **referee** and **coach** should sign the ALUC, confirming that all information is accurate.
- Submission: Once completed and signed, two copies of the ALUC (one from each team) should be returned to the Referee Station.

### Why the ALUC Matters:

- Dispute Resolution: In the event of a dispute or question regarding the game, the ALUC serves as the first reference point. If additional information is needed, both referees and coaches may be contacted to provide more details.
- Match Record: The ALUC also provides a historical record of each match, ensuring consistency and accuracy in game tracking for future reference and league purposes.



## **PET POLICY**

**Region 73** asks that you please **leave your pets at home** when attending soccer games and practices.

Over the years, we have received numerous complaints about **unleashed dogs** on and around the soccer fields. This violates region 73 rules and AYSO National Rules and Regulations. More importantly, it is a **safety concern** that affects everyone involved.

While the primary concern is with dogs, we have also had incidents involving cats, and they can pose their own challenges.

### NO PETS ALLOWED ON ANY PART OF THE FIELDS

Here is why we ask that you leave your pets at home:

- **Distractions**: Leashed dogs, or those who manage to slip their leash, can run onto the field of play, distract players, and cause accidents, including falls.
- **Potential for Bites**: Dogs on the field of play may become over-excited and could accidentally bite a player, spectator, or referee.
- Cleanliness and Hygiene: There have been instances where players, volunteers, or spectators have stepped in dog poop. This creates a health hazard and an unpleasant experience for everyone.
- **Risk of Injury**: A soccer ball being kicked could easily injure your pet, which we want to avoid. We care about both the safety of our players and pets.
- **Fear and Allergies**: Some players are afraid of dogs, while others may have allergies, making it uncomfortable or unsafe for them to be near animals.
- **Safety Hazards**: Loose dogs, or even leashed dogs that are not properly controlled, pose a serious safety risk to everyone present.
- Aggression: There have been reports of unleashed dogs attacking other dogs, including leashed ones, and cats.

### **Enforcement**

- **Immediate Removal**: If you bring a dog (or any pet) to the soccer fields, you will be **asked immediately to remove** your pet from the premises.
- **Cats**: While cats may not be as common in the fields, they can also react unpredictably, and we ask that they also be left at home for everyone's safety and comfort.
